The CDC in consultation with the US Department of Education, several federal agencies, and many stakeholders, developed Voluntary Guidelines for Managing Food Allergies In Schools and Early Care and Education Program to provide practical information and recommendations for each of the five priority areas that should be addressed in each school's Food Allergy Management Prevention Plan:

1. Ensure the daily management of food allergies in individual children.
2. Prepare for food allergy emergencies.
3. Provide professional development on food allergies for staff members.
4. Educate children and family members about food allergies.
5. Create and maintain a healthy and safe educational environment.
